Post Study Prospects in Germany

According to the article 3 and clause 7 of Migration and Mobility Partnership (MMP) Agreement between The Government of The Republic of India and the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany the post study prospects are :

(7) To this end, Indian students or apprentices wishing to gather initial professional experience after completing their academic or vocational training in the Federal Republic of Germany may be granted permission to continue their temporary residence in the Federal Republic of Germany for the purpose of seeking employment for up to 18 months in the framework of the applicable rules of national and European Union law, the length depending on the respective qualification. In the framework of the applicable rules of national and European Union law and after the successful search for an employment, the students and apprentices may be granted a residence title, issued with a validity of up to four years, for the purpose of employment, which may be prolonged indefinitely provided proof can be furnished of an adequate employment corresponding to the qualification obtained in the Federal Republic of Germany.

According to Embassy of India in Germany, the post study prospects in Germany are as follows:

Following a stay for the purpose of study under Articles 16b or 16c of the German Residence Act and successful completion of the studies in Germany a temporary residence permit is issued for 18 months to find a job related to the field of study.
