Post Study Prospects in China

According to the Embassy of India in China the Post Study prospects in China are as follows:

Prospects of extension of visas for interns/job seekers

Job seekers can apply for Employment visa (Z Visa) once they receive offer letter from any company in China and work permit issued by Labor Ministry of China (assisted by the employer). After reaching China and joining the respective company, visa can be extended to Residence Permit through Enter Exit Office of the National Immigration Department. Work related opportunities for students completing their graduation.

Students can apply for jobs in China after their graduation. At present, all companies follow the online/virtual channels to apply for the job, subsequent interviews, if shortlisted and sending the offer letter. Job opportunities depend on the requirements of the company and skill set of the applicant. However, companies in China prefer at least masters degree with some work experience as well as applicant's optimum Chinese language skills to offer jobs. Work related opportunities for students completing their graduation in Hong Kong

There are jobs and internship programs available in Hong Kong for students completing their graduation across various industries, including finance, technology, logistics, tourism, etc. While English proficiency is valuable, having knowledge of Mandarin or Cantonese can significantly enhance job prospects. Cantonese, in particular, is the dominant language for daily communication and local business interactions.

The Immigration Arrangement for Non-local Graduates (IANG) of the Department of Immigration allows non-local fresh graduates to stay in Hong Kong for 12 months without restrictions to seek jobs. Graduates who secure employment during this period can apply for a work visa to continue working in Hong Kong. Details can be found at:

Students can obtain visa extension on case to case basis if they secure a research fellowship. Furthermore, ndian students pursuing higher education in China on student Visa cannot work while on student Visa.
