Post Study Prospects in Ireland

According to the Embassy of India in Ireland the Post Study prospects in Ireland are as follows:

International students who are engaged in full-time study for at least one year's duration, currently do not need a work permit to work in Ireland.

Students can do part-time job for maximum 20 hours in a week. For full time job after completion of their graduation, they can apply for 2 years work visa.

It may be possible for international students to stay in Ireland after completing studies for the purpose of seeking employment under the Irish Third Level Graduate Scheme. This scheme exists to allow legally resident non-EU third level graduates to remain in Ireland in order to look for employment or apply for a green card/work permit.
